Thoughts from Bro. Robert:

There is a theory that says all preachers have one main point that shows up every time they preach. Recently, I was talking to a pastor friend of mine about this theory. He asked what his main point always was and I was able to answer him easily. Then he told me that my main point was, "we're doing pretty good, but let's try to do even better." He was right. God calls us not just to be at our best, but to be like Jesus. That's a high bar that has been set. However, there is such reward in the pursuit of trying to be like Christ. This reward is joy.

The more we try to be like Christ and the more we are shaped into the image of Christ the more joy we have. I've often bluntly said a Christian might be depressed, they might be going through a hard time, but if they are a Christian there will be a joy in the midst of the chaos. By no means is this joy a sense of euphoria all of the time, nor does it mean life is perfect, but having the joy of Christ means that we are always connected into true hope.

Let's chase after joy. At this point in my ministry at Marion UMC I'm seeing three main areas we need to press on for more joy.

- 1. We need to continue to work to live into our vision statement: "A Church on Fire for Jesus Christ Setting the World on Fire for Jesus Christ." Let us be zealous in this time because now more than ever we are being called to witness to the world and to other Christians that the only way to live is to live all in for Jesus.
- 2. Let's work on marriage. There is not a time in any married person's life when they should not be working on their marriage. This is an area of ministry I've grown incredibly passionate about. When a man and woman come together in marriage they are showing the world the relationship between Christ and His Church. That means we need to be doing everything that we can in order to show more love and have stronger marriages.



We're going to start down the path of intentional marriage ministry. 

We need to remind ourselves regularly that we have enough and that we need to invest our treasure in bringing people to Christ and changing lives. Please continue in your generosity and see where you can increase your giving. You will continue to see regular financial updates in newsletters and bulletins so that you are informed about the state of giving.

I pray that during this Lenten season you are chasing after Christ. I pray that you are growing to be more like Christ. And I pray that we will all celebrate His resurrection together on Easter.

After Moses killed the Egyptian, he fled to Midian, where he spent 40 years in the desert tending flocks (Acts 7:30). Moses interceded on Israel's behalf for 40 days and 40 nights (Deuteronomy 9:18, 25). The Israelites wandered for 40 years (Deuteronomy 8:2-5). Goliath taunted Saul's army for 40 days before David arrived to slay him (1 Samuel 17:16). Jesus was tempted for 40 days and 40 nights (Matthew 4:2). There were 40 days between Jesus' resurrection and ascension (Acts 1:3).





Trustees Report

A new pump was installed in the area between the education building and the gym. The old pump was no longer able to handle the volume of water in the area during hard rains.

The heating system controlling the sanctuary and surrounding area incurred difficulty heating as a result of two units shutting down. One unit was an easy repair; however, the second unit has been shut down for an extended period while further maintenance is needed.

We are happy to report that three of the four leaks in the kitchen area have been fully repaired. After the rain on February 23, it was evident that we had one area needing additional work in the kitchen above the prep table.

We have removed an additional portion of sheetrock in the gym area to continue elimination of the existing water leak. Also, work has been completed to the window located in the area as a precaution. The hard rain on February 23 caused an additional issue with water holding in the area outside the gym. This will also need to be addressed before we can approve moving forward with installation of the flooring. Please bear with us on this project.

We are happy to report that the projector system in the Family Life Center was put to use for a meeting on February 22nd and will again be used for the Created By God study series in March. Please keep this area in mind for future events where audio and visual needs are required.

We have installed all seven louvers on the Family Life Center. The old louvers were rotten and allowing water to enter the building. We hope that this will eliminate any further leaks in that building.

We are working with Entergy to replace the parking lot lighting with LED lighting. This is a great opportunity for the church to not only lower utilities but we will also receive incentive funds for the project.

We are getting ready for work in the children's area over spring break. Carpet in the children's hallway will be removed and replaced with VCT flooring. Also, the nursery will be painted before placement of three murals. Other areas to be addressed during spring break will be repairs to flooring tiles in the sanctuary, and filling in holes in the youth building flooring.

PRESCHOOL





The children took advantage of playing inside during the cold season. They can't wait until spring and enjoy playing outside on the playground.






CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

Kid Check

Kid Check was first recommended by our Children's advisory board and implemented as a security system for children's department on January 31st. It has been challenging at times as we work through the trials of a new process in our children's department. It has evolved as a much more beneficial tool than just the advertised benefits below. We have already experienced having a visitor from another state whose information was already in the KidCheck program from another church and was easily able to check in with this system.



Advertised Benefits

Easily create and update a list who can (and cannot) pick up your children Upload photos of children and guardians for added security Provide medical and allergy information and alerts

Additional Benefits Observed since implementation

Provides name tags for our children (Helps our volunteers that don't know all the children)

Provides name tags for our volunteers (Helps families identify our many volunteers by name)

Easily identifies visitors (Helps them feel a part of our church family which can be scary for a first time visitor with children)

Provides contact information on all our families of children for follow up or outreach the church may want to initiate for special events

Challenges

Providing a stream line process:

- A) Added 2 stations: 1) check in
 - 2) new registrations or updates
- B) Create lanyards for 4th, 5th and 6th graders eliminating parent check in for this age group
- C) Create name badges for all volunteers eliminating check in requirements

We are working to train everyone supporting our children to embrace the new process and help in implementing a seamless solution at MUMC. Thanks everyone for your patience as we implement this system for our children
